

THE CONVERSATION

Fashioned after a series of imaginary dialogues between two of Italy's most iconic designers, "Elsa Schiaparelli and Miuccia Prada: On Fashion" showcases the work of these seemingly diverse women as it uncovers surprising similarities in their respective approaches to design. On view May 10 through August 19 at The Costume Institute of The Metropolitan Museum of Art, the 80-piece retrospective will examine Schiaparelli's work, closely associated with the Surrealist movement, from the late 1920s to the early '50s, and Prada's affinity for Postmodernist design, highlighted through signature objects created in the last 25 years. Innovative and provocative, the exhibit offers an engaging look at the stylish genius inherent in both design pioneers. metmuseum.org

JIA DE VIVRE

Jiun Ho de Jia, an 11,000-square-foot studio in San Francisco's SoMa district, clearly defines the eclectic global aesthetic for which its designer namesake is known. Part showroom, part gallery, part design lab, the recently opened space contains rotating installations promoting the work of international artists and craftspeople; hand-selected antiques and pieces from Ho's personal collections amassed across 94 countries and informed by 20-plus years of travel (such as the Loire Valley-inspired, cowhide-and-steel St. Cere chair, shown); and a wine-and-beer bar and state-of-the-art kitchen from Gaggenau that provide unique culinary pairings for special events. *jiunhodejia.com*
